STATEWIDE

All persons must wear face coverings in compliance with the county orders, rules and directives

Misdemeanor punishable by \$5,000 fine and/or 1 year in jail



HAWAII COUNTY

Required to wear non-medical face coverings over nose & mouth while in public settings

- 5 years or younger
- Health or medical conditions
- Communicating with hearing impaired
- Necessary to perform service
- Workplace risk
- At work with physical distancing
- Exercise & outdoor activity (with physical distancing)

Misdemeanor punishable by \$5,000 fine and/or 1 year in jail; businesses can refuse service



CITY & COUNTY OF HONOLULU

Required to wear face coverings over nose & mouth indoors and outdoors in public spaces; when interacting with customers, visitors, and other employees; on public transportation; in gyms; all restaurant workers

- 5 years or younger
- Within financial institutions
- When may pose a health risk
- Outdoor activity (with physical distancing)
- First responders when impeding duties

Misdemeanor punishable by \$5,000 fine and/or 1 year in jail; businesses can refuse service



KAUAI COUNTY

Required to wear face coverings over nose & mouth in any close contact setting; by employees, customers & visitors when close contact may occur

- 5 years or younger
- Eating or drinking
- Within financial institutions
- Communicating with hearing impaired
- Outdoor exercise
- Medical exemption required

Misdemeanor punishable by \$5,000 fine and/or 1 year in jail



MAUI COUNTY

Required to wear a face mask or cloth covering the nose & mouth while in public settings

- 5 years or younger
- Within financial institutions
- Permissible exercise (with physical distancing)
- Trouble breathing, unconscious, incapacitated

Misdemeanor punishable by \$5,000 fine and/or 1 year in jail; businesses can refuse service

STATE ORDERS

8/11/20-9/30/20 - 14-day interisland quarantine if arriving by air on any island except Oahu

Large Venues and Clubs

Oahu Only 8/8/20-9/10/20: Parks, beach parks & beaches, offshore islands & islets, sandbars
Direct access to ocean for water activity only

Misdemeanor punishable by \$5,000 fine and/or 1 year in jail



HAWAII COUNTY

9/4/20-9/19/20: Beach parks and coastal parks

Nightclubs, Large Indoor or Outdoor Venues (Concerts, Sports, Conventions, and expos) and Road races (Marathons, Triathlons, etc.)

Misdemeanor punishable by \$5,000 fine and/or 1 year in jail

Theaters, Nightclubs

Misdemeanor punishable by \$5,000 fine and/or 1 year in jail

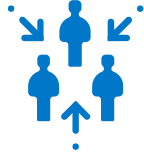


MAUI COUNTY

Nightclubs, Theaters, Public Gathering Venues, Banquet Halls, County Community Centers and County Gymnasiums

Misdemeanor punishable by \$5,000 fine and/or 1 year in jail

GATHERING SIZE LIMITS

Gatherings of up to 10 indoors and outdoors

Misdemeanor punishable by \$5,000 fine and/or 1 year in jail



HAWAII COUNTY

Gatherings of up to 10 indoors and outdoors

Sports practices limited to 25 and competitive play up to 50

Misdemeanor punishable by \$5,000 fine and/or 1 year in jail



CITY & COUNTY OF HONOLULU

All public and private gatherings of any number of people occurring outside a single household/living unit are prohibited unless specifically allowed in the Essential Activities section

Gatherings of up to 10 indoors/25 outdoors

Gatherings of up to 10 indoors and outdoors

Misdemeanor punishable by \$5,000 fine and/or 1 year in jail

OAHU STAY-AT-HOME ORDER

What's Allowed for Your Business



ESSENTIAL ACTIVITIES

- Engaging in activities or performing tasks essential to health & safety
- Obtain necessary services or supplies
- Engage in allowed outdoor activity
- Visit essential businesses
- Care for a person or pet in another household
- Visit graveyards & mausoleums (10 people maximum)
- Go to work at an essential business or to perform an essential job function
- Attend religious services while adhering to restrictions
- Individual activity in gardens and parks, and on beaches



ESSENTIAL JOB FUNCTIONS

Even if your business is not included on the list of essential businesses, you can go to work if you perform one of the following basic operations:

- The minimum necessary activities to maintain the value of the business's inventory, ensure security, process payroll and employee benefits, or for related functions.
- The minimum necessary activities to facilitate employees of the business being able to continue to work remotely from their residences.

ESSENTIAL BUSINESS CATEGORIES

In many cases, additional requirements apply. The "essential" offerings must be the primary business.

- Public works construction, construction of housing, airport operations, water, sewer, gas, electrical, oil refining, roads and highways, public transportation, solid waste collection and removal, internet, and telecommunications systems
- Essential government functions
- Healthcare operations
- Grocery stores, certified farmers' markets, farm and produce stands, supermarkets, food banks, convenience stores, and related services
- Food cultivation, including farming, livestock, and fishing
- Businesses that provide food, shelter, and social services, and other necessities of life for economically disadvantaged or otherwise needy individuals
- Newspapers, television, radio, and other media services
- Gas stations and auto and bicycle supply, auto and bicycle repair, towing services, and related facilities
- Banks and related financial institutions
- Hardware stores
- Plumbers, electricians, exterminators, and related service providers
- Mailing and shipping and delivery services
- Educational institutions for purposes of facilitating distance learning, performing critical research, or performing essential functions (does not apply to DOE or University of Hawaii)
- Laundromats, dry cleaners, industrial laundry services, and laundry service providers
- Restaurants and other facilities that prepare and serve food, but only for delivery or carry out
- Businesses that supply products needed for people to work from home
- Businesses that supply other Essential Businesses with the support or supplies necessary to operate
- Airlines, taxis, and other private transportation providers, vehicle rental services, paratransit, and other transportation services
- Home-based care
- Professional services, such as legal or accounting services, insurance services, real estate services when necessary to assist in compliance with legally mandated activities
- Childcare facilities providing services that enable employees to work, or engage in activities as permitted
- Facilities and shelters for seniors, adults, and children
- Businesses that provide food, shelter, and other necessities of life for animals
- Hotels, motels and related service providers
- Funeral, mortuary, cremation, burial, cemetery, and related services with limits
- Critical trades
- Critical labor union functions
- Licensed private detectives
- Fabric sellers/suppliers, under certain conditions
- In-person spiritual services
- Film and television production
